During the exhibition WHAT IF Unbuilt Architecture in Switzerland (25 Nov. 2023 - 7 April 2024) the S AM Swiss Architecture Museum is launching a rich education programme for kindergartens, schools, universities, institutions and day centres. Dialogue-based guided tours and workshops within the current exhibition WHAT IF Unbuilt Architecture in Switzerland are offered at the respective appropriate level, as well as Tandem guided tours in cooperation with Kunsthalle Basel. These can also be booked outside official opening hours, making it possible to have the unique experience of being alone in the museum. In addition, tours on foot or by bike are an invitation to make discoveries outdoors. Teachers are offered continuing education and training, so they can get to know the museum as an out-of-school education venue.

DISCOVERY TOURS

TOUR 1: ART IN THE PUBLIC SPACE
