# OPEN CALL FOR PARTICIPANTS

Summer School 'Filming the City' with Bêka & Lemoine hosted by S AM Swiss Architecture Museum in collaboration with LINA the European Architecture Platform Basel, 26 June - 30 June 2023

The S AM's summer exhibition 'Homo Urbanus: A Citymatographic Odyssey by Bêka & Lemoine' examines the relationship of people to public space through a filmic investigation of ten global cities. With the support of LINA, a European network of architectural institutions, the S AM is organizing a week-long summer film workshop that applies these methodologies to the local context: Basel.

Directed by Ila Bêka and Louise Lemoine of Bêka & Lemoine, this workshop held in English focuses on the potential of the filmic medium in articulating alternative identities for the city, one based less on representative images and monuments, but rather the everyday actions and movements of its inhabitants.

The workshop's main emphasis is on the quality and relevance of ideas and a unique point of view. In other words, innovative and thoughtprovoking positions should be the focus, instead of a search for technical and aesthetic perfection. Technique will be seen as a tool - not a goal.

Over the course of five days, 15 participants will gain exposure to basic concepts of film technique and theory as applied to architecture and the city. Following a crash-course on representative





approaches to architecture on film, participants will quickly dive into the production phase, identifying sites in Basel to work on, developing scripts, filming, editing, and undertaking post-production in quick succession.

The final output of the workshop will be a short (ca. 3 min) film representing a personal, sharp, and critical interpretation of the relationship that Basel has developed with its river. On the evening of the final day, all the works produced will be presented in the form of a miniature film festival.

The workshop is augmented by a series of theoretical inputs in the form of lectures and presentations by Beka & Lemoine and visiting LINA fellows from outside of Switzerland.

Participants are expected to be able to dedicate the hours of 9:00-18:00 during the week to the workshop.

# Prerequisites

- Photographic equipment able to take video (video camera or good smartphone)
- Laptop computer with video editing software (DaVinci Resolve, Abobe Premiere)
- An openness to learning something new
- Enjoyment of discussion and exchange with other participants
- No previous filmmaking experience required

Participation in the summer school is free of charge. However, participants are expected to organize their own accommodation, transportation, and food costs during the duration of the summer school. Neither the S AM nor the LINA program are able to assist in the organizing of accommodation while in Basel.

Ila Bêka and Louise Lemoine are visual artists who work in a variety of media, such as video, installation, photography, and books. They experiment with new narrative and cinematic forms to explore how people experience, perceive, and relate to space from an emotional, social, and cultural standpoint.
